Large Ensemble Directors



HPMC Orchestra Director: Julia Cunningham

Julia Cunningham is the current orchestra director in Beloit, KS where she teaches 4th through 12th grade orchestra. She is a Southwestern College graduate where she received her bachelors in String Music Education and Viola Performance. Prior to Beloit, she ran a private studio where she taught violin, viola, and piano. As a performer she has played in the Williams String Quartet, Delano Symphony Orchestra, South Kansas Symphony, Newton Mid-Kansas Symphony, and the Salina Symphony. She has also performed in the pit for productions of Little Women, Bright Star, and Fun Home. This is her fourth year as High Plains Music Camp Faculty.



HPMC Orchestra Director: Nathan Mark

Nathan grew up in Topeka, KS, and got his undergrad from Washburn University in 2008. That Fall, he started teaching orchestra in Hays, KS, and has since received his master's in music education from Wichita State University in 2014. He has performed with the Hays Symphony and multiple quartets. In addition, he has also taught at this camp for several summers off and on.



HPMC Orchestra Director: Matthew McGrory

Dr. Matthew McGrory is Associate Professor of Music and Director of Orchestras at Garden City Community College, as well as Music Director of the Southwest Kansas Youth Orchestra. Prior to his appointment at GC3, Dr. McGrory taught orchestra and band in the public schools of Spring Hill, Kansas for four years and orchestra in Lawrence, Kansas for one year. Dr. McGrory also served as adjunct faculty at Northwest Missouri State University and Ottawa University, teaching low string lessons and string methods.

An accomplished double bassist as well, Dr. McGrory has performed with regional symphonies all over the Midwest, including subbing for the Kansas City Symphony and serving as Principal Double Bass for the Saint Joseph Symphony, Midwest Chamber Ensemble, and section bass for the Topeka Symphony. While at KU, Dr. McGrory performed with the University of Kansas Wind Ensemble and can be heard as the solo bass on Pete Meechan's work "Dreams Unseen," which won the 2023 American Prize in Band/Wind Ensemble Performance.

At Garden City Community College, Dr. McGrory directs the orchestra, teaches coursework in string music, jazz improvisation, and teaches applied lessons for all string instruments. As an active researcher, Dr. McGrory's research examines parental influences in instrumental music education, string pedagogy, and music performance anxiety. His papers have been submitted for publication in *British Journal of Music Education*, *Music Education Journal*, and *American String Teacher*, and published in *String Research Journal*. Dr. McGrory is also an active member of the Kansas American String Teachers Association, serving as the Solo Competition Chair.



Palmer HS Band Director: Peter Lillpopp

Dr. Peter Lillpopp is the Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at Fort Hays State University. At FHSU he directs the Wind Ensemble, teaches courses in band techniques and conducting, and teaches applied low brass. Peter is also the Director of the High Plains Music Camp and the Kansas State Band Chair of the National Band Association. While at FHSU, Peter has collaborated with numerous artists and composers including a 2019 premier by composer, Daniel Morel. Peter has presented at several regional and national conferences in Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska, and Florida. He has presented at the College Band Directors National Association Southwestern Division Conference at the University of Colorado Boulder. Prior to his 2017 appointment at FHSU, Peter taught at the University of South Dakota and was a public-school music teacher in Texas and Connecticut for seven years. He is a graduate of the University of Southern California, University of North Texas, Hartt School, and the University of Colorado Boulder where he earned the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Wind Conducting and Pedagogy.



Palmer HS Band Director: Aunna Marzen

Dr. Aunna Marzen is a trumpet player and conductor currently based in Hays, Kansas. She currently serves as the Associate Director of Bands and Assistant Professor of Trumpet at Fort Hays State University.

Dr. Marzen earned her Doctor of Musical Arts in Trumpet Performance from the University of Maryland, where she served as a Graduate Assistant with the UMD bands. She has performed with a wide range of ensembles across the United States and internationally, with featured appearances at prestigious events such as the National Trumpet Competition, the International Trumpet Guild Conference, and the College Band Directors National Association (CBDNA) regional and national conferences.

A dedicated educator performer in the marching arts, Dr. Marzen performed with the Santa Clara Vanguard and Colts Drum and Bugle Corps before transitioning into instructional roles. She has served as a brass and visual instructor for the Crossmen Drum and Bugle Corps and is currently a member of the brass instructional staff for the Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps. Dr. Marzen

holds a Master of Music degree from Florida Atlantic University and Bachelor of Music degree in Trumpet Performance from the University of Iowa. She is a member of Kappa Kappa Psi and Sigma Alpha Iota and is also an honorary member of Tau Beta Sigma. Her principal teachers include Chris Gekker, Dr. Michael Votta, Dr. Amy Schendel, Dr. Aren Van Houzen, and Dr. Courtney Jones. Dr. Marzen is a proud native from the greatest corn-growing state in the country, Iowa.



Tiger MS Band Director: Johannah Cox

Johannah Cox, retired, has taught instrumental music for 40 years in Kansas. She was Director of Bands at Liberty Memorial Central Middle School in Lawrence for the last 34 years of her teaching career. Prior to coming to Lawrence, she taught in the Salina Public Schools from 1979-1985. She holds a Bachelors and a Masters degree in Music Education from Fort Hays State University. Johannah has served on the faculty of the High Plains Music Camp, Midwestern Music Camp and the Kansas International Lions Band. In 1985, the Kansas Bandmasters Association (KBA) named Johannah Outstanding Young Band Director. She served as the first woman President of KBA in 1989. Johannah is also a member of the Kansas Music Educators Association and the National Association for Music Education (NAfME). In the spring of 2009, she was named the Secondary Master Teacher of the Year for USD 497. Johannah was named the Outstanding Bandmaster for 2013 awarded by KBA. In the fall of 2018, she was named the 2018 Educator Impact Award winner by the Lied Center of the University of Kansas and the North East District Middle Level teacher of the year. Johannah is a woodwind specialist and runs a clarinet studio. She is on a lifelong quest for the world's most perfect reed! In her retirement she directs the New Horizons Band in Lawrence and is personnel manager for the Lawrence City Band.



Faculty Jazz and Palmer Jazz Band Director: Jonathan Yust

Jonathan Yust is the Director of Bands at Ulysses High School and taught previously at Holcomb High School. He is a graduate of Fort Hays State University and did graduate work in jazz trumpet at the University of North Texas. He has taught trumpet at Garden City Community College and frequently performs with the Flatland Big Band. In the summers, Jonathan performs with the Garden City Municipal Band and teaches at the High Plains Music Camp at FHSU.



Tiger Jazz Band Director: Makenzi Johnson

Makenzi Johnson is co-director of bands at Garden City Community College, with her husband and co-director CM Johnson. In 2008, she was commissioned by Fort Hays State University to write a piece for wind ensemble. In 2009, she won the KMEA composition competition with that piece - "Elegy of the Hunter." She completed undergraduate degrees in music education and music composition in 2011 from FHSU. In December of 2020, she completed her graduate degree in music composition also from FHSU. She enjoys composing for anything band - solos, small ensembles, full symphonic bands and wind ensembles. Arranging impressionist compositions for wind ensemble has been of recent interest. In the fall of 2022, the Garden City Municipal Band commissioned her to write a band piece for the 145th consecutive anniversary season called Hell's Aquarium. It is written about the fascinating history of pre-historic Kansas and the frightening sea creatures that existed in this Southwest part of the state. In the spring of 2021, she was named co-chair of the KMEA Jeff Jordan Composition Competition; a competition for high school and collegiate composers in the state of Kansas, of which she was a former winner. The competition was re-named in honor of her late beloved teacher, Dr. Jeff Jordan. She will be forever grateful for his wisdom. In 2019, she was commissioned by Kansas Wesleyan University under the direction of Dr. Carl Rowles to write a middle school band piece honoring the 100th anniversary of the 19th amendment, titled Shine On! Awards include the KMEA Jeff Jordan composition competition winner (collegiate division), the KBA Future Young Band Director Award, and the Crystal Apple Educator Award.



Camp Chorus Director: Nicholas Carr

Nicholas Carr is Director of Choral Studies at Shawnee Heights High School in Tecumseh, Kansas, and directs the Topeka Youth Symphony and Shawnee Choral Society. He holds a Master of Music Education in Choral Conducting from Kansas State University and a Bachelor of Music Education from Washburn University. With over 20 years of directing experience across choral, instrumental, and handbell ensembles, Carr's work emphasizes musicianship, theory, and social-emotional growth. His Shawnee Heights Choraliers performed at the Kansas Music Educators Association conference in February 2025. Honors include USD 450's Most Inspirational Teacher (2022) and KMEA Northeast District High School Choral Director of the Year (2024). Carr lives in Topeka with his wife and two sons.
